## CALL FOR PAPERS

India is, currently, a \$2.8 trillion economy; to reach the \$5 trillion mark by 2024, the economy would require nominal growth in dollar terms of over 12% which is challenging but realizable. India could & should aspire to double-digit growth. Without sustained growth at that level it has little hope of employing the roughly one million young people who join its workforce every month. And unless it takes advantage of its current, favorable demographics it is never likely to emerge as an upper-middle-income economy with a prosperous and thriving middle class.

The Indian state today remains under-resourced & under-powered. It is set up more for a large agrarian economy than it is for global production or sophisticated manufacturing. It struggles to implement large-scale infrastructure projects or to regulate complex sectors independently & transparently. Supportive markets for land and labor simply do not exist. Energy supply & infrastructure are far better than they were, but still not up to the standards required to build a world-class manufacturing sector. Progress on economic reform is constrained by a lack of consensus, across the political spectrum, about its nature & scope. Government has made some ambitious reforms, such as, introducing a goods and services tax, and made headway in speeding up infrastructure projects. But parts of the economy remain unreformed, and questions persist about the sustainability of economic growth.

How will the world deal with a country that has the aggregate size, & the aspirations, of a putative superpower but whose politics, state & capabilities have remained relatively unchanged? It will not be easy. Other countries have graduated, one way or another, from developing-country status. What happens when India becomes one of the three or four largest economies in the world in dollar terms, but retains the attitudes & requirements of a developing country?

The idea of the conference is to highlight important and critical issues of the aim of Indian economy to reach the \$Five Trillion Economy mark. Besides this, the interest is to raise the standards of research and its dissemination through knowledge creation, and capacity & competence building. The conference shall ensure that economic thinkers, academics, researchers, policy makers and other experts continue to enlighten the minds of students, corporate and others by their intense understanding and insights into crucial domains of economics which would further enrich knowledge, & provoke learning & research.

- Researchers and Practitioners can submit their Papers exclusively on central theme and also they can submit papers specific to the track.
- The Abstracts should be no more than 250 words with Purpose, Methodology, Findings, Research Limitations, Practical Implications, Originality/ Value, & Key Words.
- The particulars regarding the title of the paper and author(s)'s name(s), designation(s), official address(es), phone/fax number(s) and e-mail address(es) should also be mentioned along with the abstract on a separate sheet for blind peer review.
- Papers should not exceed 10,000 words in length (all inclusive) with an abstract of no more than 250 words.
- Manuscripts in Microsoft Word (12 point Times New Roman font, double spacing and 1" margins on all sides).
- Authors should include figures and tables within the text where they are intended to appear.
- All the accepted papers for presentation will be published in the proceedings.
