

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
SECTION-I About The College

LIBRARY

Our library has a rich collection of 53,695 books covering an array of different disciplines. It subscribes to 14 Hindi & English Newspapers and 16 magazines and journals at present.

An E-Resources facility is also available through which students and teachers can access the world's best databases, DULS, E-Journals, E-books, N-List and Reports.

Our library is automated and ensures the availability of current titles by consulting publishers, catalogues, book reviews and publishers' websites. Open access facilities for students and staff are available on the ground floor and upper library building. The College Library is air-conditioned. The library has installed new software named 'Footfall', to mark the attendance of teachers and students.

COLLEGE NURSERY

The College nursery (Manikarnika Udyan) is not only a testament to the tireless efforts of the Garden Committee but has also garnered recognition by winning prizes at Delhi University Flower Shows. The Committee remains active throughout the year.

During the challenging times of the COVID-19 pandemic, the presence of plants provided much-needed stress relief. Recognizing their therapeutic properties, the Garden Committee raised awareness among faculty and students about the numerous benefits of herbal plants, such as Holy Basil, Mentha, Stevia and Lemongrass etc.

Currently, the Committee's emphasis is on promoting oxygen-generating indoor plants to purify indoor air. The Garden Committee is committed to fostering a sense of responsibility and appreciation for the natural world that surrounds us.



World University Service (W.U.S)

RESERVATION OF SEATS FOR SCHEDULED CASTES (SC) AND SCHEDULED TRIBES (ST) APPLICANTS

- 22.5% of the total number of seats is reserved for applicants belonging to Scheduled Castes and Scheduled Tribes (15% for Scheduled Castes and 7.5% for Scheduled Tribes, interchangeable if necessary)
- It is a statutory obligation on the part of Colleges to fill all seats reserved for Scheduled Castes/ Scheduled Tribes applicants.
- Colleges shall not refuse admission to any SC/ST applicant on the basis of medium of instruction. Any deficiency in the knowledge of any particular language should be addressed; for this purpose remedial classes may be arranged by the College by utilizing grants available from University Grants Commission.
- Relaxation to the extent of 5% in the minimum marks shall be given to the applicants belonging to SC and ST to determine their eligibility and merit for admission to the course concerned.
- In case, after giving 5% relaxation, the reserved seats still remain vacant, further relaxation would be given to the extent required in order to fill all the reserved seats. (AC Resolution A88, 14.6.1983) (EC Resolution 157.24.12.2001). It is obligatory for all Colleges /Departments to fill all the seats reserved for SC/ST applicants. Eligibility in these cases is pass percentage.

The following are empowered to issue the requisite SC/ST certificate:

- (a) District Magistrate/Additional District Magistrate/Collector/Deputy Commissioner / Addl. Deputy Commissioner / Deputy Collector / 1st class Stipendiary Magistrate/City Magistrate / Sub-Divisional Magistrate/Taluka Magistrate / Executive Magistrate / Extra Assistant Commissioner.
- **(b)** Chief Presidency Magistrate / Addl. Chief Magistrate / Presidency Magistrate. Revenue Officer not below the rank of Tehsildar.
- (c) Sub-Divisional Officer of the area where the Applicant and / or his family normally resides.
- (d) Administrator /Secretary to the Administrator/Development Officer (Lakshadweep Islands) The applicant must note that the SC/ST Certificate from any other person/authority shall not be accepted in any case. If the applicant happens to belong to SC or ST, applicant's caste/tribe must be listed in the appropriate Govt. of India Schedule.

The Caste Certificate should clearly state: (a) Name of his/her caste/tribe (b) whether applicant belongs to SC or ST (c) District and the State or Union Territory of applicant's usual place of residence and (d) the appropriate Govt. of India Schedule under which his /her caste/tribe is approved as SC and ST.

If applicants do not have their SC or ST caste/tribe certificate at the time of registration/applying, they may upload the acknowledgment slip of the SC or ST caste/tribe certificate application. However, at the time of admission, the applicant will have to produce the valid original SC or ST caste/tribe certificate.

However, if an SC/ST applicant seeks admission under some other category (for example : PwD/Employee Ward etc.) the applicant should satisfy the minimum eligibility requirement for that particular category.

Note: SC/ST applicants who get admission under open merit (unreserved) shall not be included in the reserved quota, i.e. 22.5% (15% for SC and 7.5% for ST).

It is obligatory for all Colleges /Departments to fill all the seats reserved for SC/ST applicants. Minimum Eligibility in these cases is pass percentage.

RESERVATION OF SEATS FOR OTHER BACKWARD CLASSES (OBC, NON-CREAMY LAYER, CENTRAL LIST)



- 27% seats will be reserved for the applicants belonging to Other Backward Classes (OBC) (non-creamy layer, central list).
- At the time of giving admission to an OBC applicant, the College will ensure that the caste is included in the Central List of OBC (the OBC status is to be determined on the basis of the Central (Govt. of India) List of OBCs notified by the Ministry of Social Justice and Empowerment on the recommendations of the National Commission for Backward Classes available at the website http://ncbc.nic.in/backward classes/index.html.). The issuing authority for OBC Non-Creamy Layer certificates is the same as for SC/ST.
- The certificate must mention non-creamy layer status of the applicant (Non-creamy layer status issued by an authority mentioned in DOPT Office Memorandum no. 36012/22/93-Estt. (SCT) dated 15.11.1993).
- The OBC applicants who belong to the 'Non-Creamy Layer' and whose caste appears in the Central List of the OBCs only, shall be eligible to be considered for admission under the OBC category (Validity period of OBC certificate in respect of 'non-creamy layer' status of the applicants as per DOPT Office Memorandum No. 36036/2013-Estt. (Res-I) dated 31 March 2016). The validity of the non-creamy layer certificate shall be for the financial year 2024-25, issued after 31st March, 2024.
- If the applicant does not have the OBC non-creamy layer certificate of the latest financial year(2024- 25)at the time of registration, the applicant may upload the previously issued (older) OBC non-creamy layer certificate or the acknowledgement slip of OBC non-creamy layer certificate application. However, at the time of admission, the applicant must produce the recent financial year's (2024-25) OBC non-creamy layer certificate, issued by the same competent authority. This additional certificate must have reference of the applicant's already issued original caste certificate.
- The OBC applicants shall be given a relaxation of 10% in the minimum eligibility marks of the said course and for the admission entrance test a relaxation of 10% of the minimum eligibility marks prescribed for General / UR Category applicants.
- It is a statutory obligation on the part of Colleges to fill all the seats reserved for OBC applicants.

RESERVATION POLICY FOR ECONOMICALLY WEAKER SECTIONS (EWS)

As per the University of Delhi notification, Reference No. Aca.I/Reservation of EWSs/2019/63 Dated 28th March 2019 and Reference No. Aca. I/Reservation of EWSs/2019/101 Dated 15th May 2019, for the reservation for Economically Weaker Sections (EWSs) Category, the University Departments / Centres / Colleges have reserved 10% seats for admission for the same for this Academic Year, 2024-25. The eligibility of such applicants will be decided on the basis of fulfilling criteria prescribed in the above notifications and subject to submission of documents, issued by the competent authority, in the format provided in Appendix V.

RESERVATION FOR CHILDREN/WIDOWS OF PERSONNEL OF THE ARMED FORCES (CW)

- 1. Five percent (5%) of seats are reserved for applicants under this category, course-wise in all colleges.
- 2.All such applicants have to upload the Educational Concession certificate in the enclosed format sample to be issued by any of the following authorities on the proper letterhead:
 - a. Secretary, Kendriya Sainik Board, Delhi
 - b. Secretary, Rajya Zila Sainik Board
 - c.Officer-in-Charge, Record Office
 - d.1st Class Stipendiary Magistrate
 - e. Ministry of Home Affairs (For Police Personnel in receipt of Gallantry Awards)



RESERVATION OF KASHMIRI MIGRANTS (KM) (SUPERNUMERARY SEATS)

- 1.All the wards (sons/daughters) of Kashmiri Migrants who wish to be considered for admission to various undergraduate courses of the University have to register online as per the schedule notified by the University.
- 2. Up to 5% seats are reserved course-wise in all colleges for the wards of Kashmiri Migrants.
- 3.All the wards of Kashmiri Migrants will have to upload a certificate of registration as Kashmiri Migrants issued by Divisional Commissioner/Relief Commissioner.

PRIME MINISTER'S SPECIAL SCHOLARSHIP SCHEME FOR J&K STUDENTS

Candidates desirous of taking admission under the Prime Minister's Special Scholarship Scheme for J&K students must appear in CUET (UG) - 2024.

Nomination of Seats for Sikkimese Students (SS)

Candidates desirous of taking admission under the Sikkim nomination scheme must appear in CUET (UG) - 2024.

Sikkimese students nominated by the Govt. of Sikkim shall be considered for admission by the University in Colleges where hostel facilities are available (AC Resolutions 51 dated 05/06/1980 and 122 dated 17/12/1990). The allocation of Sikkimese students for admission as well as for hostel accommodation in respective colleges will be made by the Vice-Chancellor at his discretion.

Ward Quota of Employees of University of Delhi (WQ)

Candidates desirous of taking admission under the Ward Quota of Employees of University of Delhi must appear in CUET (UG) - 2024.

Admission to the wards of University and its College employees, both teaching and non-teaching will be done as per Academic Council resolution 9 a & b dated 27.11.2020 and subsequent amendments there of. Candidates must be in possession of a valid Employment Certificate issued by due officials at the time of registration.

Only the Employment certificate uploaded at the time of registration will be considered. I-cards, Aadhar Card and/or any other document will not be accepted. Admissions under ward quota for each college will be determined in three Program Clusters namely viz. Humanities, Commerce and Sciences. The allocation will also depend upon the number of Programs offered in a College/Department. Allocation of Ward Quota will be based on merit scores of candidates in program clusters and the order of preferences given by the candidates. The seats under ward quota allocated for teaching and nonteaching will not be interchangeable. However, allocations may be considered within the program clusters to maximize the benefit. Appropriate proration in CUET scores may be done to ascertain cluster-based merit.

Orphans Quota (OQ)

Candidates desirous of taking admission under the supernumerary Quota for Orphans must appear in CUET (UG) 2024

The University of Delhi will be admitting two candidates (one male and one female) in each program of study, both at the Undergraduate and Postgraduate level, These two seats will be supernumerary. The Council of the University further resolved that the expenditure incurred for admission and continuance of study of such students in the University or its Colleges shall be met from the University Welfare Fund or College Students' Welfare Fund, as the case maybe, for admission in the University or in the College.

A candidate who wishes to seek admission under the orphans quota must posses a certificate from a Govt. recognized Orphanage/Charitable Home or Death certificate of both the parents.

As per University Notification No. Acad.I/Orphan Quota/2024-25/10 dated 16th January, 2024 -

- 1. Candidates seeking admission with effect from the Academic Session 2024-25 onwards under the Orphan Quota shall pay the following fees:-
- i. Admission Fee Rs. 10.00
- ii. Examination Fee Rs. 10.00
- iii. Hostel Fee Rs. 10.00
- 2. Students availing hostel accommodation shall pay Mess Fees as per actuals.



EXTRA-CURRICULAR AND SPORTS QUOTA (SUPERNUMERARY SEATS)

Candidates desirous of taking admission under the supernumerary quota for ECA and/or Sports must appear in CUET (UG) - 2024.

For admissions to ECA and Sports supernumerary seats a weightage of 25% will be given to CUET score and 75% to certificates/trials/performances.

Note: Every care has been taken while describing the provisions regarding reservation in this prospectus. However, the information contained in Rules, Regulations, Ordinances and Statutes of the University regarding any type of reservation provision shall be final. 

FINANCIAL ASSISTANCE, SCHOLARSHIPS AND ACADEMIC PRIZES



1. FEE CONCESSION

Financial Assistance is given to deserving and meritorious students in the form of fee concession. Students desirous of getting fee concession should apply on the prescribed form available from the college office on the date to be notified. The consideration of fee concession depends upon good conduct and satisfactory performance of the student in the examination. Failure to show satisfactory performance, either in terms of academic results or discipline might lead to withdrawal of concession.

2. STUDENT AID FUND

The College has established a students' Aid Fund for the benefit of students. The object of the Fund is to render financial assistance to deserving students to meet their tuition or examination fee or to purchase books.

3. SC/ST/OBC/PwD SCHOLARSHIP

Students belonging to SC/ST/OBC etc. recognized by the Government of India are allowed scholarship by the state government. Such students are required to apply on the prescribed application form within a notified period to the respective authorities of their states through the College. Eligible SC/ST, OBC, PwD students etc. should submit their scholarship form for the academic year by February, for processing scholarship to SC/ST, OBC, PwD etc. each year.

4. RAILWAY CONCESSION

Student proceeding to join their parents at the home town from the college and back during vacations can avail railway concession. For this purpose, permanent home town address declared in admission form at the time of admission is final. It must be clearly understood that the railway concession facilities cannot be extended for visiting places of relatives or for excursion. Any changed address must be intimated directly by the parents as soon as such change takes place. Request for change of address must be supported by documentary proof/evidence.

5. VICE CHANCELLOR'S FINANCIAL ASSISTANCE

This Financial Assistance will be awarded to those students whose family income from all sources is less than 1 Lac per annum and having BPL valid ration cards issued from competent authority.

6. OTHER DELHI UNIVERSITY AWARDS & FINANCIAL ASSISTANCE:

There are many Awards / Financial Assistance / Scholarship schemes which are declared by the University from time to time. Students are advised to see the Notice Board for details.

ANTI-RAGGING RULES

- In case any student, who has obtained the degree of Delhi University, is found under this Ordinance committing an act or practice of ragging, he/she may be subjected under Statute 15 to appropriate action for the withdrawal of degree conferred by the University.

FOR THE PURPOSE OF THIS ORDINANCE, ABETMENT OF RAGGING WILL ALSO AMOUNT TO RAGGING.

RAGGING RELATED COMPLAINTS

Any student aggrieved in this matter may fearlessly approach Convener of the Discipline Committee or any staff member of the college for speedy disciplinary action. Anyone found guilty of ragging may be subject to any one or more of the following punishments:

- Rustication from the college
- Suspension from the college or classes for a limited period or Fine with a public apology
- Withholding scholarships and other benefits
- Debarring from representation in college events
- Withholding results
- Handing over case to the Police, if need be.

NOTE: It is mandatory as per the Hon'ble Supreme Court & UGC/AICTE Regulations that all students fill in an Anti-Ragging Affidavit, each year. To make the process easy MHRD has developed an ON LINE Facility. Affidavits can be filled ONLINE at: www.amanmovement.org (OR) www.antiragging.in

The budget proposals were necessary for the vision of Viksit Bharat towards 2047 but not sufficient for employment opportunities, told former VC Dr Goel.


