### Prof. Nachiketa Singh



Prof. (Dr.) Nachiketa Singh is presently serving as Principal, Shyam Lal College (Eve.) University of Delhi. In his long career as an accomplished academic he has served the University of Delhi in different capacities. He was earlier the senior most faculty in the Department of Political Science, Sri Guru Tegh Bahadur Khalsa College, University of Delhi. He has nearly 30 years of teaching and research experience to his credit in the field of international relations, foreign policy, global politics and governance. Besides teaching and research activities, his academic work includes development of course curriculum both at the university and national level. His other academic work includes research guidance to M. Phil and Ph. D students and collaborative project work involving students and fellow colleagues. His areas of specialisation and expertise are international relations and foreign policy, on which he has published several research papers in reputed journals.

Prof. Nachiketa Singh Singh has recently completed the ICSSR Minor Research Project on 'Empowering women through Capacity Building: Role of Common Service Centres in Rural Odisha', based on which he has published a research article "*Women's Empowerment in Rural Odisha: Mapping Common Service Centres as a Critical Enabler*", in IASSI Quarterly, Jan-March 2024. Prof. Singh's recent book on *Mapping Governance Innovations: Perspectives from South Asia* (eds.) 2024, published by Routledge, Taylor & Francis group, is widely acclaimed that contributes to the body of knowledge on South Asia, Public Policy, Governance and Administration and addresses the gap areas in the concerned areas of academic inquiry.

As an ICSSR Research Fellow Prof. Nachiketa Singh had earlier undertaken research on *Ethnic Conflict and Internal Security and its Impact on International Politics*. He has done his

PhD on *Ethnic Conflict in Former Yugoslavia and its Impact on International Politics*. His research work revolved around the impact of ethnic revival in internal politics and non-conventional security threats in the contemporary world. He is also working on external dimensions of internal security of India with reference to counter insurgency strategies and terrorism in the Indian sub-continent.

Prof. Singh has contributed to the development of Online Courses (MOOCs) under UGC as Subject Expert in Political Science and has also served as a member of Committee of Courses and Board of Studies in Delhi University and other Universities. He is a member of the Academic Advisory Council of Consortium for Educational Communication (CEC) under UGC for development of MOOCs. He takes keen interest in both national and international politics and delivers talks and lectures in seminars and conferences on various aspects of foreign, economic and security related issues. He has published several research articles in reputed journals on global politics and regional geo-political issues in South Asia. He has published several research papers in various social sciences journal and authored chapters in edited books. Prof. Singh has served two terms as an elected member of Academic Council of Delhi University [2015-2019] where he has worked in several statutory committees of the University appointed by the Vice-Chancellor. He has recently served three years term as an Academic Council member at Central University, Pondicherry and is currently serving as a nominated member of the Academic Council of Delhi University again. Apart from his active teaching and research work, Prof. Singh has vast experience of administration and governance, where he has demonstrated exemplary leadership.
