Inter-College Debate Competition

Under the leadership of **Dr. Kusum Devi** as Convenor and the tireless efforts of its dedicated members—**Dr. Sandhya Verma, Dr. Surbhi Badhwar, Dr. Karan Gupta, and Dr. Megha Jain**—the society has organized various intellectual and thought-provoking discussions over the past year. With each event, the society continues to promote the art of debate and democratic dialogue among students, empowering them to be thoughtful, articulate, and responsible citizens.

In line with this mission, the society successfully organized a **prestigious Inter-College Debate**Competition on 3rd April 2025 on the thought-provoking topic:

"Immigration Poses a Threat to the Culture and Security of a Nation."

This timely and relevant theme sparked intense intellectual exchange and inspired critical reflection, especially in today's globally interconnected world. Abhijit, Anwar, Samreen and Anshul (Volunteers); Neha and Kritika (Anchors) for their involvement in each detail of the event.


