

RUSKIN BOND and his magic of Children's Literature

Well Dear students those of you have done your Undergraduate may be knowing about Bond and his magic in a novella named Sussanah's Seven husbands, prescribed in your syllabus of semester 6 of the DSE paper of Children's literature. In my opinion each of you should know about his literary journey and the magic of his writings.

Ruskin Bond is conferred Sahitya Academy award, India's highest literary honors, reading this news English literary scholars became overwhelmed, including myself. Bond, an Anglo Indian born on May 19, 1934, in Kasauli, India. Losing his parents at a tender age, he found solace in books and nature, laying the foundation for his illustrious writing career. Ruskin Bond's early life was marked by both solitude and adventure, as he navigated the picturesque landscapes of India's hills especially The Himalayas fascinated him the most.

His literary journey commenced with the publication of his first novel, "The Room on the Roof," at the age of seventeen, which earned him the prestigious John Llewellyn Rhys Prize. This marked the beginning of a prolific writing career that would span over six decades and penned numerous novels, short stories, essays, and poems for both children and adults.

Ruskin Bond is a master storyteller known for his captivating tales set against the backdrop of the Himalayas often infused with a deep love for nature and an appreciation for the simplicity of life in the hills. His stories are known for their rich characters, vivid descriptions, and nostalgic charm. Some of his most famous works include "The Room on the Roof," "Dust on the Mountain", "The Blue Umbrella," "Our Trees Still Grow in Dehra," and "Rusty the Boy from the Hills" series.

Ah..... Rusty! This name deserves special mention, as Rusty is a semi-autobiographical figure in many Bond stories and his most beloved literary creation, my beloved too. Rusty is a boy full of sparkle in his eyes .Bond projects him as a lean statured adolescent with unkempt hair and always a curious expression on face. He wears simple clothing best suited for the nomadic life of hills yet charms the readers a lot.

Bond created this character in the novel The Room on the Roof. This is the novel where we first met Rusty, an anglo Indian orphaned boy .The novel has its setting in the hills of Mussorie and Dehradun where Rusty befriends certain group of locals and is shown enjoying adolescent life

by way of adventures and experiences. As we can understand the story is inspired by Ruskin Bond.s own adventures it deals with many themes such as friendship, innocence, joys, confusions of a lonely heart and life Lessons. Rusty's defining trait is his insatiable curiosity about the world around him. He is always eager to explore new places, meet new people, and uncover the mysteries hidden in the hills.

Next most notable feature of Rusty is his vivid imagination. Although Rusty doesn't play a central role in this story, named The Blue Umbrella, he serves as a narrator who witnesses the transformative power of a simple blue umbrella on the lives of the characters around him, showcasing his imaginative skills. This is the story of a small girl named Binya and her love for her possession blue umbrella which she exchanged for her lucky pendant of leopard claw. The screen version created by Bollywood director Vishal Bhardwaj is a favourite watch among kids.

In Rusty Runs Away ,unhappy living in strict guardianship after being orphaned Rusty, a boy of adventurous nature and his spirit to travel the world runs away from the house. In another story named Rusty Plays Holi he is shown enjoying the festival of colors and festivities.

The Cherry Tree . This story revolves around Rusty's encounter with an abstruse old man and his cherry tree, exploring themes of friendship, loss, and the passage of time. Resilience is a characteristic feature of Rusty. In spite of facing various hardships and setbacks, Rusty demonstrates remarkable resilience. He learns to adapt, to change and confronts adversity with courage and determination. Symbol of survival and struggle, from the Cherry tree we learn how a small seed can become a tree full of fruits when it is nurtured properly.

For those of you who are not aware, let me share with you that Ruskin Bond lives in Landour and meets his ardent fans often at Cambridge Book Depot, Mall Road ,Mussoorie. About a decade ago when I was on my vacations to Mussoorie I met this man of great literary prowess. After my formal introduction I could ask him about his deep rooted love for India and that why he decided to stay back being of the 'Anglo-Indian origin. I bought myself 'Dust on the Mountain' collected stories from the Cambridge Book Depot which is a store house for all Bond works. He is so generously affectionate to have autographed it and even allowed me to be clicked with him. I am sharing the pictures here.

In very recent years, Ruskin Bond is facing health challenges. While details about his specific health issues may be limited, Bond's steadfast determination to continue writing and

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engaging with his readers stands as a testament to his unwavering commitment to the craft. Despite the hurdles he has faced, Bond's literary output remains as prolific as ever, inspiring readers and writers alike with his poignant tales and timeless wisdom.

Beyond the Sahitya Akademi Award, Bond's mantlepiece boasts an array of prestigious accolades, including the Padma Shri, and the Padma Bhushan, conferred upon him by the Government of India for his invaluable contribution to literature.

From the core of my heart I wish that Ruskin Bond stays healthy and continues to house in the verdant hills of his beloved India, house in the hearts of readers around the world. Bond's words continue to weave magic, inviting readers both teachers and students alike on a journey of discovery, empathy, and hope. As he continues to grace the literary world with his presence, Ruskin Bond remains a guiding light, reminding us of the beauty of simplicity, the resilience of the human spirit, and the timeless enticement of storytelling.

GROW A PLANT TODAY

Plants are incredibly diverse and can be classified into several groups based on their characteristics. General classification that we make: **Flowering-**Rose, Jasmine; **Foliage-**Ficus, Ferns; **Herbal-**Basil, Lemon grass; **Ornamental-**Ornamental kale, Aglonema.

Other classifications on the basis of size, duration or location are as follows: **Trees-** Banyan, Neem, Amaltas, Mango; **Shrubs-**Rose, Hibiscus, Plumeria, Coleus; **Herbs-** Coriander, Mint, Ginger; **Climbers-**Jasmine, Aparajita, Allamanda, Madhumalti; **Annual, Biennial or Perineal-** Rice, Wheat, Corn, some varieties of carrots, Fruits. **Indoors-** ZZ, Monstera, Pothos, Spider plant and **Outdoors-**Mogra, Tuberose etc..

This article focuses primarily on plants that can be grown indoors and can be gifted on different occasions for further propagation. Indoor plants are becoming very popular in urban areas due to various factors like paucity of sunlight and space.

PLANTS OUR LIFELINE

Plants are indispensable to human life, providing everything from food and medicine to materials and environmental benefits. Their uses span across various industries and cultural practices, making them a vital part of our daily lives and the global economy. Each part of plant is useful for us. By understanding the diverse roles plants play, we can ensure a sustainable future by planting more and taking care of already existing green areas.

Food and nutrition-Rice, Wheat, Spices, Fruits and Vegetables, Tea and Coffee.

Medicine and health- Neem, Tulsi, Insulin, Stevia, Aspirin from willow bark.

Material and construction-Teak, Bamboo, Cotton, Jute.

Environmental benefits- soil stabilisation, oxygen and air purification e.g. Snake plant, Spider plant, Pothos.

Aesthetic and cultural usage- gardening, indoor decoration and landscaping e.g. Roses, Marigold, Hibiscus etc. Peepal is considered sacred and Marigold and Mango leaves are used in religious ceremonies.

Industrial and commercial use- Rubber, oil and perfumes from Lavender and Jasmine plants, Sandalwood powder and oil.

Bioenergy- Sugarcane and Corn can be processed into biofuels like ethanol which can be used as renewable energy sources.

Fibers and papers- hemp for making ropes, paper from wood pulp from trees like Bamboo and Eucalyptus.

Thus everything that surrounds us seem to be a plant product. Given their indispensability, we need to grow and nurture them. Indoor plants bring a little piece of nature outside into our house.

CARE OF PLANTS

Care begins the moment we decide to go green. Selection of a right plant is a good beginning. Plant should not be too delicate or difficult to grow. Soil, water, place and regularity make a big difference.

Visiting a nursery and selecting a healthy plant- Best practise would be visiting a nursery nearby after deciding where we would like to place our plant, whether there is sun or shade. Select plants with lots of roots and healthy leaves. Buy a larger pot if you intend to transfer the plant that you brought from nursery.

Drainage and repotting- Pot should have holes. Water collection causes roots to rot and plant dies. Wet the soil as it is easy for roots to explore the wet area and settle in new environment better. Gently remove the plants and transfer it to new pot. Add some extra soil and press it gently. Water a little bit so that the old soil gets some moisture as well.

Watering-Overwatering and under watering is probably the single most common reason why a lot of house plants die. Water requirements of all plants are different and indoors require much less water. Soil should be dry between watering. Drain off pool of water. Plants need frequent watering in summer and less in winter.

Nutrition and light- Houseplants need soil, good light and some water to thrive. Commonly missed is the fertiliser which is plant food e.g. bone meal, packs available at nursery, neem ki khali etc. Small amount of fertiliser need to added at intervals. Some plants need light, some need shade but all of them need some source of natural light.

Grooming, pruning and saving from insects- Insects and bugs love dead and decaying foliage. Remove any dry or rotting leaves that are just sitting on the top of soil. Prune the leaves that are about to die, this will save nutrition. Inspect the leaves and see if there are any signs of


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
any insects and bugs. Take a picture and go to local nursery for help.


As plants also have life cycle, they die due to neglect, disease or naturally. So a beginning should be made with hardy plants, Succulents and pothos are a lot easier to take care of. They are less fussy than some of the plants.

TEN EASY GROWIG PLANTS

These plants can be easily grown and maintained at home. Most of them are indoors and need very less Sunlight. They are available in our college nursery- Manikarnika. Asparagus fern, Philodendron, Monstera, Eternity plant, Hongkong palm, Syngonium, Spider plant, Sensevieria, Golden Pothos and Jade plant etc. These plants symbolise devotion, prosperity, wealth, good luck, joy, stability in life, tolerance, good luck etc..









Plants, like books, provide inspiration for our attitude towards everyday life. They promote good heart and good thoughts as they bring in lots of positive energy. They adapt themselves to the environment and never stop growing and thus impart such an important lesson of life.

Gandhian spirituality a salvation for the problems of the world

Gandhi was not only a spiritually evolved person, he was also concerned about all the worldly problems poverty, inequality, injustice. For him, spiritual evolution was not possible without taking care of less fortunate people. He strove to make his politics religious, not in narrow sense of the term, but as an ethical practice.

Gandhi's fertile mind also engaged with the whole range of issues around us- from the importance of cleanliness to the status of women, from the revival of traditional arts and crafts to the wrongs of trade and economy under imperialism.

His thoughts were not merely idle musing, but an outcome of his sustain practice. That philosophy, which is not made part of his life, was according to him, "dry as dust,". thoughts, words and deeds were a peace in his case.

Gandhiji was uniform with Mansa, Vacha and Karmana. Truth in him was distinguished in its perfection. The urge for 'purity of practical and means' is a proof of this transparency of his life. At the same time Gandhi was a practical person who considered himself a "practical idealistic", as one, who combined high moral adventure tasks with a series of "experiments with truth". To him, his experiment with Truth was even more important than his experiment with non-violence.

In the year 1936, Sarvepalli Dr. Radhakrishnan published a book called 'Contemporary Indian Philosophy' from London with an article of about 25 great Indian thinkers. In this Mahatma Gandhi said -

'I am a Hindu from religion who is the religion of humanity for me and in which the best of all religions known to me. In this religion, I went through the path of truth and non -violence, in broad sense. Instead of saying that 'God is true', recently I have started saying 'Truth is God ' to define my religion. Because people can deny God but the truth cannot be denied. Even the most ignorant of humans, there are some truth among them. We are all flashed with truth. The gross -composite of this flask - that is, unknown truth, is God. I reach near it every day with the help of continuous prayer.

This is the culmination of Indian spirituality which can be seen completely reflective and result in Mahatma Gandhi's life and behavior. This spirituality can be understood only by going into the depth of human existence and values.

Additionally, I wish to turn to one of the anecdotes from Babu ki jhankiyan by Kaka Sahab Kalelkar. In 1930 when Gandhiji was in Yerwada jail, Kaka Sahib was also with him. They were

using the spinning wheel but the string of the carding-bow had become slack with the moisture in the air during the rainy season and the fibres of the string got ruffled so to smoothen the fibre they used neem leaves. Kaka saheb writes:"one day Bapu noticed that I was in the habit of breaking of a whole twig for the sake of four or five leaves. Where upon, he said: "this is Himsa. Others might not be able to understand but you can. Even these four leaves should be plucked by us humbly, with due apologies to the tree. You break off whole twigs."

What Gandhiji said is revealing at so many levels. We noticed that his notion of violence was so subtle that he was hurt if even a twig was broken. Moreover, we can see his concept of economy, that is ,not to use a twig where four leaves are sufficient, regardless of the "value" of that twig. But what made him a true Mahatma was his advice to offer apologies to the tree before plucking-"humbly" - those four leaves. In that one sentence we can see the very sense of his worldview. This is not the only incident of its kind. Such respect and humility was prevalent for nature into his daily life.

The trusteeship is a socio-economic philosophy that was propounded by Gandhiji. It provides a medium to rich people by which they can help poor and helpless people. This theory reflects the spiritual development of Gandhiji, which was developed by the study of Theosophical Literature and Bhagavad Gita.

For this reason, Gandhian spirituality is not only, moral and religious, but is also a traditional and modern and simple and complex. It is a symbol of many Western influences, which were revealed by Gandhiji, but it lies in ancient Indian culture and follows universal moral and religious principles. This philosophy is present at many levels of spiritual or religious, moral, political, economic, social, personal, collective etc.

The art of volunteering for your community: a guide to being a hero

When we were little, how many of us would stay glued to our television, watching cartoons or movies with men in disguise, wearing capes, flying around town, saving and seizing the day, and thus wished for ourselves to be that same heroic and brave character, admired and adored by others, the perfect role model — a hero? I'd say most of us.

There was a charm in those characters, a sense of comfort brought by them through their courageous acts and unwavering determination to help those in need while struggling with their own lives and often having to conceal their identity and work in stealth while being ever so cool, that would win our hearts; but hear me out when I say that being a hero is not just a fictional fantasy dream that seems far unattainable, and whether one decides to work alone and secretly, it turns out to be something anyone from any part of the world can be, that is, if they truly care enough to make a difference for the world to be a better place. (And there you go; that makes it step 1.)

Realising dreams to aiding dreams:

Step 2 to become a hero would be to search for ways in which you can help your local community and to seek opportunities and use your various platforms to stand up for things and issues you care about. This means being productive for the general welfare of society that affects it directly or indirectly, and the hardest part is to act in the first place (step 3), to not be hesitant or lose your goodness and compassion because of one bad experience.

And how do you do that? By engaging with others through community service and working for the upliftment of underprivileged sections of society, we learn to communicate effectively and accurately and be mindful of our actions and words towards others, develop social skills and empathy, and build meaningful relationships. These skills are essential in building successful intra- and interpersonal relationships and careers. A person gets emotional maturity through these interactions that can shape their lives for the better, making them a much-deserved hero.

Volunteers are often the glue that holds a community together, connecting with people that belong to various different socio-economic backgrounds with different upbringings and financial backgrounds, gaining a wider perspective of the world. It also gives one more exposure and maturity when he comes across people from distant communities and sections of society, getting to know different voices and issues of people that are relevant and persisting. One such place I recently came across that helped me, along with many others, to fulfil their childhood-born dreams of being a hero was the Delhi-based NGO Pehchaan The

Street School, which has a mission to provide free education to underprivileged children and raise their voice for their cause.

Pehchaan The Street School

Pehchaan The Street School is a Delhi-based NGO that has been working for the past ten years with the ultimate aim of providing free quality education to children belonging to the underprivileged sections of society. It also provides vocational skills to people of all ages along with timely visits to doctors and dental clinics, provides stationery and educational supplies, as well as gifts to its students that are supported by donations and fundraising initiatives. There are 10 operational centres all around the NCR region with over 1600+ students and over 1500+ volunteers and interns, both on and offsite, who work together towards a common goal of social upliftment and empowerment of underprivileged people. There are also about 15 international volunteers from different countries working selflessly towards community welfare in India. To act when it counts most and play your part with sincerity and compassion is the motto of all our volunteers.

For most of us volunteers who work online or offline, Pehchaan The Street School became a channel through which we could fulfil our dreams of helping others in a productive manner by teaching them, spending time and building meaningful bonds with them, raising awareness about their needs and rights in society, aiding in a holistic education that encompasses both textbook knowledge and recreational learning, striving to provide equal opportunity for our students, writing about them, and arranging fundraisers and awareness campaigns so more people can connect with Pehchaan The Street School and perhaps realise their own dreams while helping give wings to the dreams of academic and skill growth of the students.

And not for nothing, because the students we teach, mostly aged below 16 years, are not only intelligent and smart but are also fun to be around with. Our interns have always emphasised how kind and loving the students are; on one instance, when one student was given a chocolate, her first thought was to share it with her teacher and eat it with her; these little gestures are what drive us to work harder for the success of the students so they too can grow wings and learn to dream big. They lighten the room with their magical smiles, and their personal curiosity and determination to succeed and learn new things make all our efforts worth it. Though they are of very young age, they might be more or equally as mature and emotionally intelligent as most adults. Most of them come from very humble backgrounds where attaining formal education becomes a challenge, with some unable to dedicate long hours each day in schools or are made to work small jobs to meet their circumstantial demands. Despite their busy schedule at home, through Pehchaan The Street School's weekend classes, they find more flexibility and ease to take their classes with the teaching interns who do their best to educate the students through a fixed curriculum.

The Role of youngwomen in shaping the goal of vikshit Bharat 2047

"*There is no chance for the welfare of the world unless the condition of women is improved. it is not possible for a bird to fly on one wing*"-swami vivakanand

Vikshit Bharat 2047 is the part and parcel of panch pran of Amrit Kal, which aims to make india develop or to achieve the target of 30 Trillion dollar economy by 2047.

In order to achieve this goal the role of youth is very crucial as per united national population fund the average age of population of india is 28 years so India has exceptionally young population which led india to pass through the golden window of demographic dividend in coming 20 years (2020-40). The Role of young women will also play the pivotal role in this.

In view of ensuring their role in shaping the goal of vikshit Bharat they must be provided a level playing field. For that government of India has shifted its notion from the development of women to women led development which means development of the country will happen due to contribution of women.

Education is the key priority to strengthen the potential of women. Government has taken various initiatives in that particular direction. for example sarva siksha Abhiyan that ensures education for all, Madhyamik siksha Abhiyan which has increased women enrollment in secondary education.

Apart from being educated they must be properly skilled thereby they can diversify their employment avenues. At the present time women are mainly concentrated in pink collar jobs like nursing, social work, teaching etc. if they have proper skill set then they can get more job opportunities that will increase the workforce of the country. India has targeted to increase female labour force participation upto 70 percent by 2047. There are many government schemes for skill development like pradhan mantri Kaushal vikash yojana, jan sikshan sansthan especially designed to impart vocational education etc.

Most importantly women must be politically represented because the problem associated with the women can be understood by a women in better manner. In order to materialise that particular thing government came out with 73rd and 74th constitution ammendment in which one -third seats are reserved reserved for women in local government bodies. Apart from that in106th constitution ammendment act which is called 'Nari Shakti Bandan Adhyniam' which also provides 33 percent reservation of women in Lok Sabha and state legislative assembly so whatever policy will be formed that will be inclusive.

Women can not contribute in the development of the country unless they are financially independent in view of that the gender budgeting has come into the picture. In financial year

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2025-26 the gender budget scale upto 8.8 percent of total budget which showcasing government strong commitment of government towards economic empowerment of women. Government is also consistently promoting women entrepreneurship through various initiatives like standup india scheme and microfinance with getting access to credit.

Lakhpati Didi scheme is a revolutionary initiatives taken by government. This scheme has targeted around two crore women in self-help group to provide that much skill set so that they can earn one lakh annually.

Pradhan mantri jandhan yojana provides them access to Bank accounts. In National rural livelihood mission, women in self-help group comming together pulling the resources and get the access of formal credit. once they have Bank account, they have access to formal credit therefore they can start new business, ventures, provide employment to others, promote innovation and pay taxes to the government because of that the development of the country will be accelerated.

One of the most cross cutting points is that there is need to bridge the gender digital divide. women should also be imparted digital literacy so that they can make themselves competent in the era of technology. Digital india mission is working in this direction.

At the present time women presence are also manifested in the defence also. Government has opened the avanue National Defence Academy for permanent commission in officer entry. Women are also inducted into armed forces through Agnipath scheme, they are also holding command position at present time. Through this way they are availing the opportunity to serve the nation at front.

There are few challenges associated with the role of women to make our country devloped . At the present time 90 percent women are still employed in informal sector or gig workings. There is lack of job security. As we know that due to the rural urban migration male members have migrated to cities that led feminization of agriculture happened. As per the economic survey 2024-25 more than 50 per cent women are involved in agricultural activities but they own less than 11 percent of land which restrict them from getting loan through kishan credit card.

At last I conclude my points though men and women are biology different from each other but they have the same brain. The goal of vikshit Bharat will be shaped by brain activity through critical thinking or innovative ideas. So that there is need to provide opportunities to women in each and every field so that they can unlock their untapped potential while would be also favourable for country developmental point of view.
